Financial Update – with a *huge* Thank You

As many of you now know, an unexpected and amazingly generous gift of \$7500 was received on Kick Off Sunday Sept. 13. The giver anonymously left the money with this note:

You will find a tithing gift for Springdale Lutheran. This is unexpected and is the result of a generous transaction to me. I have always been taught and followed the teaching to give to the Lord, first. My Lord and I have agreed many years ago to follow this practice. So put this to good use as needed and give thanks to the Lord for he truly has been good to me. May the Lord watch over and care for this church and all who care for her.

Whether that individual was a member or not, we hope he or she sees our heartfelt thanks and continues to be blessed as this gift has blessed and supported us!

Our General Fund deficit has thus been *substantially* reduced to around **-\$8,500**, and if, as indicated by summer survey returns, another \$7000 above regular giving might also come by year's end, we could virtually eliminate a gap that had seemed a *two* year project at the beginning of this year.

The extravagant witness of that one giver is a sign of enormous hope in the future of Springdale. And we know from past experience that you members foster the same hopes for this congregation as you've risen to meet our challenges and needs. If weekly offerings maintain around \$3000 and the additional pledges are filled, we could well end one of our most difficult years in the black.

Council will continue to keep the congregation informed of progress, and once more we *thank* all who have made commitments, *encourage* those thinking about it and *invite* everyone to respond with time, talent or treasure as we continue renewing Springdale's worship, education and outreach.

The Treasurer shall receive all monies and record all individual and special gifts, shall have charge of all funds and valuable documents, pay all bills authorized by the Congregation Council, keep an accurate account of all funds, furnish regular reports to the Congregation Council and an annual audited report to the congregation or whenever required.

Qualified candidates should have some accounting background. This is an annually appointed, not elected, position and receives a small remuneration.

September 17, 2009

I. Devotion

II. Secretary's Report

Motion carried to approve the Minutes as printed.

III. Treasurer's Report

As of September 17, 2009, the General Account balance

is behind **\$8,274.51**. This is an improvement over previous months and due in large part to the most generous gift by an anonymous donor.

Motion carried to use the \$371.72 in undesignated memorial money to purchase a new bulb for the Sunday School PowerPoint projector. A sincere thank you is extended to all donors that have made it possible to support the continuing education of our youth.

IV. New Business

Discussion was held on the new worship format Overall, the new format was well received but it is still a work in progress. Suggestions on community worship welcomed. The mortgage is coming due and SBCP is willing to renegotiate with perhaps a one-half point reduction. They need to see a financial statement through October 31. A review of the current Yellow Pages ad revealed needed changes. We will reduce the overall size, go to text only and omit the worship service hours. This will reduce the monthly cost and be more flexible when making changes to worship and/or education hours.

It is time to get the Nominating Committee to work putting together the ballot for 2010. A review of the projected openings was conducted.

V. Old Business

We reviewed the time and talent sheet that was passed out last month. A change in format was suggested. The benevolence focus for the rest of year will be:

In this year of transitions, our challenges have moved us to make significant changes, and we've seen encouraging signs as worship and education were re-energized and finances received a major boost. But there's a lot to be done for Springdale to continue as a vitalized, visionary community of God's people, and as much as ever we need each Springdale member committed to helping do it.

Your completion of this enclosure is a sign of ongoing commitment to your congregation. I wish to briefly review each section:

Newsletter Information

Easiest of all! To conserve physical and financial resources, the "View" will be all online come January. Yet we know some are only able to receive it by mail, and while we hope that number is limited, we aim to accommodate those.

Time & Talent Information

This *is* more of a challenge. We call every member to active roles in our ministry by commitments in three (if not more) of the six areas listed. Some of these are weekly or monthly, some may be four or five times or only once a year. Yet if every confirmed member gave one day – eight hours – of time, 2000 hours additional ministry would be accomplished.

Financial Pledge Information

Most challenging of all, probably. Congregational leadership has frequently been told, especially this year, to manage budget by watching expenses, and it has striven to do so. But there are *two* necessities in responsible budgeting: knowing expenses *and* knowing income. Springdale usually knows yearly expenses, but we've always had to guess income because pledging has rarely been asked. We call every member to give their best estimate of 2010 giving so our leaders can work with a clearer picture of both expenses and income for the coming year.

Again, thank you to each member for your thoughtful, vital commitment to the life and ministry of Springdale Lutheran Church.

Operation Christmas Child

Esther Circle invites all members of Springdale to once again participate in Operation Christmas Child. This program of Samaritan's Purse distributes shoeboxes full of gifts to some 100 countries and millions of children. They may be refugees of civil war, survivors of natural disaster or victims of extreme poverty, and they need to know that they are precious to God.

Esther Circle will provide boxes, pack and wrap them, and pay the \$7 fee to ship, but we need your help providing gifts. If each person in the congregation bought one or two gifts, think of the number we could send! Last year we had such an overwhelming response we were able to send 54 shoeboxes.

There are collection boxes in the entry where you can place gifts until Nov. 15th. Lists of suggestions are also there to assist. Please prayerfully consider this important outreach ministry and share the real meaning of Christmas with those less fortunate.

Toys -- small cars, balls, dolls, stuffed animals, kazoos, harmonicas, yo-yos, jump ropes, small Etch A Sketch®, toys that light up or make noise (with extra batteries), Slinky®, etc.

School Supplies -- pens, pencils and sharpener, crayons or markers, stamps and ink pad sets, writing pads or paper, solar calculators, coloring and picture books, etc.

Hygiene Items -- toothbrush, toothpaste, mild bar soap (in a plastic bag), comb, washcloth, etc.

Other -- hard candy, lollipops (please double bag all candy), mints, gum, T-shirts, socks, ball caps; sunglasses, hair clips, toy jewelry, watches, flashlights (with extra batteries)

A Personal Note -- in a separate envelope, you may enclose a note to the child and a photo of yourself or your family. (If you include your name and address, the child may write back.)

Do Not Include -- used or damaged items; war-related items such as toy guns, knives or military figures; chocolate or food; out-of-date candy; liquids or lotions; medications or vitamins; breakable items such as snowglobes or glass containers; aerosol cans
