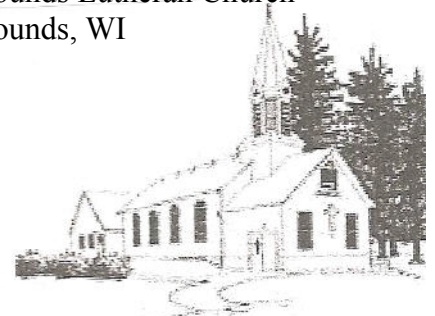

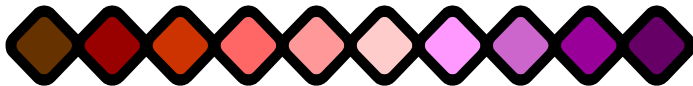
### Parish Choir

The text arranger and composer is David Haas, born in 1957, and currently living in Eagan, Minn. There he directs the Emmaus Center for Music, Prayer and Ministry and is campus pastor and artist-in-residence at Benilde-St. Margaret's High School, in addition to teaching in its theology and music departments. Haas has produced some 45 collections of music, and his liturgical works are used by many denominations throughout the world.

Wedding fee for non-members totals \$550. Members enjoy a great privilege of reduced fees – only \$50 for use of the church and \$50 for the custodial assistant – but members also accept a responsibility for supporting their parish year round.

## Springdale Lutheran Church Council Minutes - January 20, 2011 Sherri Hefty, Secretary

**Devotion** - The devotion used was Acts 2: 37-47, which is one of the texts used by the Missional Discovery team.

**Agenda** - A motion was made by John and seconded by Terry to approve the Agenda as presented. Motion carried.

**Secretary's Report** - A motion was made by Pastor and seconded by John to approve the Minutes as printed. Motion carried.

**Treasurer's Report** - As of December 31, 2010, the General Account balance is behind \$12,475.95.

The proposed 2011 budget will be reviewed and any questions answered on Sunday, January 23, following the service in preparation for the Annual Meeting.

A gift of \$400 was received from the Halena family. As an undesignated memorial, the funds will be applied to the principal of the building fund.

It was brought to our attention that there are still some funds remaining from the 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. A motion was made by Pastor and seconded by John to use those funds as "seed money" for the Collector Car and Tractor Show if needed. Motion carried.

A Blanket Employee Dishonesty Insurance application for \$40 was received from the Synod.

Coverage is up to \$25,000 and covers all employees,

volunteers and members. A motion was made by John and seconded by Pastor to submit the application. Motion carried.

**Old Business** - Pastor updated the Council on the most recent MDJ meeting, which was held at Springdale. During the month of February, he plans to use some of the MDJ bible studies, for anyone interested, following the soup suppers at West Blue Mounds on Wednesday nights. He hopes this will jump-start others, outside the group, to start thinking about where we are headed and what our mission is. A parish potluck is also being planned for February 20 at West Blue Mounds where MDJ members will be sharing information from group meetings to-date. We hope to hold "cottage meetings" this summer to focus on what our mission is.

Pictures for a joint parish directory will be taken this fall. A motion was made by John and seconded by Pastor to assemble a committee to select the photographer. Motion carried.

**New Business** - A motion was made by John and seconded by Terry to discontinue the bulk mail permit, since it costs more than our current postage needs. Motion carried.

A \$50 gift card was received from West Dane Thrivent. A motion was made by Pastor and seconded by Sherri to use these funds to purchase baptismal medallions and Confirmation crosses. Motion carried.

A suggestion has been made to have a float in the Frolic Parade to advertise the Collector Car and Tractor Show. The suggestion will be referred to that committee.

**Committee Reports** - Committee reports were received from Education and Worship & Music. Of note, Sunday School will be moved to Wednesday nights during Lent. West Blue Mounds will host in March and Springdale in April.

## ELCA National Youth Gathering New Orleans, July 18-22, 2012

“Citizens with the Saints” is the theme of next year’s event, and students currently in 7<sup>th</sup>-11<sup>th</sup> grades are eligible to attend. It’s a once-in-three-years opportunity to travel to an exciting city, meet Lutheran youth from all over the country, hear great bands and speakers and serve the church in powerful ways.

Registration opens Oct. 9 and will likely fill fast. But before then, our multi-church group (Barneveld, ELC, Immanuel, Perry & Springdale/West Blue Mounds) aims to take the fabled “City of New Orleans” train from Chicago and needs to reserve seats *this* summer.

It has been parish custom to cover transportation, housing and final registration costs, with attendees paying for initial deposit and meals. Working with the other churches on the train fund (see “Mardi Gras Dinner” under *Shall We Gather?*), we’ll also need to do in-house fundraising for remaining expenses.

## Adult Education Missional Discovery Journey Bible Study Wednesdays approx. 6:15-7:30 West Blue Mounds

As you’ve read in previous Beacon/Views, our parish’s Missional Discovery Journey is asking “*Where is God leading us?*” and “*How have we been blessed to follow and serve?*” These are questions *not* just for the MDJ Team or the councils to ponder, but for *all* our members.

In addressing those questions, whether in large group or team meetings, each of our sessions has begun with reflective Bible study – and you are invited to reflect on some of them as well in a series through Feb.

We look forward to sharing the insights we are gaining on this Journey and hearing what God’s Spirit is saying through his people here at Springdale and West Blue Mounds.

4 – One to change the bulb, one to bless the elements, one to pour the sherry and one to offer a toast to the old bulb.

How many Charismatics does it take to change a light bulb?

1 – His hand is up in the air already.

How many Catholics does it take to change a light bulb?

None – Catholics use candles.

How many Methodists does it take to change a light bulb?

29 – Twelve to form a Nominating Committee to appoint eight to serve on a Personnel Board to elect five to serve on a Maintenance Committee to assign three to create a Task Force to find one do what again?

How many Amish does it take to change a light bulb?

What's a light bulb?

And last, but not least,

How many Lutherans does it take to change a light bulb?

*Change* the bulb? My great-grandparents donated that bulb!

In such corny jokes, we may find common ground with several sister denominations. Yet under the humor, there can be pointed truths as well.

Lutherans (and others! we're not exclusivist in this) shy from change. We grow comfortable with familiar patterns because it's just easier to follow the same routine, even though we end up with diminishing returns.

The Missional Discovery Journey our parish has embarked on *is* about change – but I would hasten to add, it's *not* about radical change imposed upon us by some outside authority who “knows better” what the congregations of Springdale and West Blue Mounds are to be about. It is rather, changing to become *who we are* – recognizing we're not our great-grandparents' church nor the church we were forty or even fifteen years ago, but seeing who we are *today*, what our gifts and blessings are *now*, what are the community needs and goals we have at *this* time in our parish life.

Our MDJ team – Kim Bigler, Scott Bigler, Fay Dahlgren, Paul Elver, Sherri Hefty, Dennis Oimoen & Melba Rick – are examining and wrestling with these changes first, but they're not meant to do it exclusively. This is a journey for the whole congregation, and we want to open opportunities for all the parish to examine and wrestle

with us, to offer insight, to identify our strengths, to discern *together* where God is inviting us to go and to grow.

So again, I lift the two opportunities this month to join the journey – the Parish Potluck at Feb. 20 where team members will share our learning thus far and the Bible studies on Wednesdays through this month using the Scriptural foundations the MDJ sessions have set before us. We're not changing light bulbs . . . but a few light bulbs will go on as we look for the Spirit's leading in our mission.

## Update from Missional Discovery Journey Team

We have good news, and we have bad news. The bad news – no one has all the answers. The good news – this is a time of great discovery for us.

Change can be scary and is often equated with loss. But if things never changed, what would we have to look forward to? Change is, after all, evidence that life is taking place. Real growth though requires letting go of the past and keeping an eye focused on the future. What do we have to let go of so we can prepare for our future?

What next? The second transformational key from “[A Field Guide for the Missional Congregation](#)” is “Congregations that focus on becoming a discipling community as they deeply engage their context are more likely to develop a healthy life that moves beyond institutional survival or just serving the needs of its members.” Each of us has special gifts to offer. Just image the possibilities if we equip and empower ourselves to use those gifts as disciples in God's service.

We are all on a journey of discovery now and, with God's guidance, we have a lot to look forward to. Let's proceed into that future together with a “hands on, hearts open” approach.
